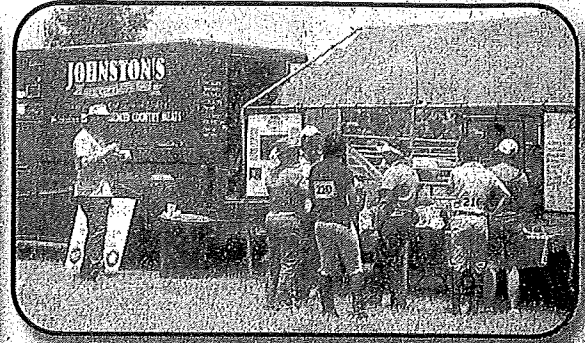
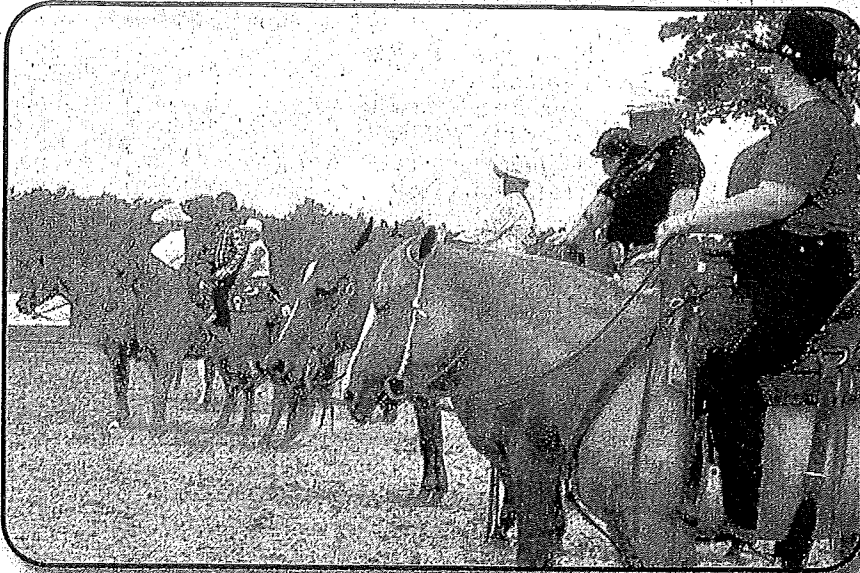


HORSE SHOW DRAWS CROWD

Everyone arrived at the Evil Twin Farms in Lamont, FL early to participate in the inaugural horse show.

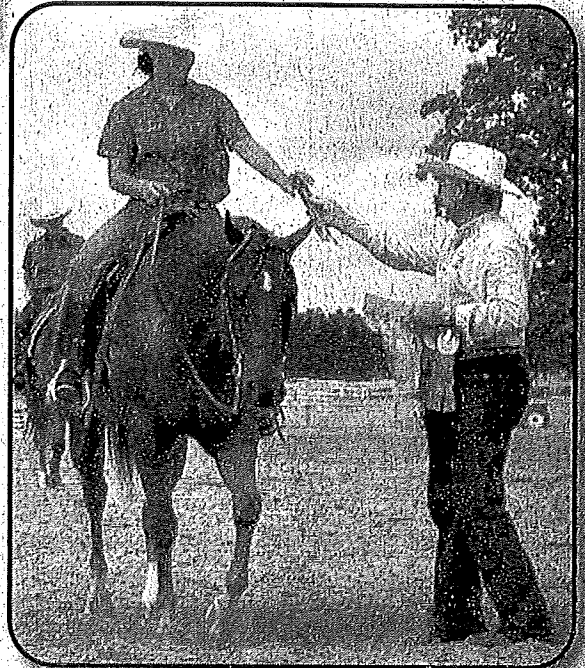
"I can't believe the turnout we had. I never expected to have
