PUREBRED STALLION SERVICE REPORT

Return to ASSRA Secretary – address on front

1. Purebred stallions, mares and partbred stallions must have their DNA results on record with ASSRA in order for their foals to be eligible for registration.
2. Once a stallion is registered to breed with ASSRA it is a condition that an SSR must be lodged by the 31st July deadline every year. If a stallion was not bred during the season, the SSR is to be marked 'NIL RETURN' and submitted by the deadline.
3. IMPORTANT: Show ALL service dates, complete registered names and number of each American Saddlebred mare covered, name and full address of the owner of the mare and exact date(s) of breeding. The manner of service must be indicated and for paddock breeding, all dates of confinement of the mare with the stallion must be shown. Incomplete reports will not be valid.
4. This report must be signed by the owner or authorised agent of the purebred stallion, being the person(s) authorised to sign the breeder's certificate for the purebred stallion. ASHAA must always be notified in the event of a change of manager or authorised agent. All signatories must be on record with the secretary and registrar.
5. If a registration application for a foal is received by ASSRA and the name of the mare (dam) does not appear on the SSR, a letter of application to amend the report must be filed by the person authorised to sign the SSR. Any foals produced by a stallion during a non-lodgement period and any foals owned by the stallion owner, registered lessee and/or manager will not be eligible for registration until the late SSR has been lodged and the penalty fee for late lodgement paid.
6. Section III - Purebred Stallion Service Reports.
Failure of the owner or manager to lodge an SSR with ASSRA for a recognised stallion by July 31st of any (breeding) year in which the purebred stallion is bred to any mare, or making a false or fraudulent statement on the SSR shall be in violation of the Code of Conduct of the Registry.
7. When a purchaser of an American Saddlebred Horse applies for registration with ASSRA with documented proof of pedigree and ownership, individual cases will be assessed by the Committee to determine if registration is possible. The Committee may rule for DNA cross-match to be undertaken using records of presumed siblings/sire/dam on record with the Laboratory. Vendors or sire owners who are Subscribers may be contacted. No unreported mating will be recognised without DNA cross-match to confirm parentage.
8. No unauthorised person will be allowed access to the information submitted on the SSR without written authorisation being received by ASSRA from the purebred stallion owner, registered lessee or manager.
9. ASSRA Inc; retains the right to Random DNA Collection and analysis which may from time to time be required if valid reason exists to parent verify a horse for which registration is sought, or, to re-verify a registered horse. Such DNA testing may be conducted by the ASSRA Inc; at its own expense. In which case;
 - a. If after inspection any doubt still exists as to parentage of the horse, the owner of such horse shall permit and co-operate with the Registry in effecting such DNA analysis as required.
 - b. If after testing correct breeding is not able to be established by the Laboratory, the owner or breeder of the horse shall be required to reimburse the Association for all costs incurred in performing collection and analysis.
