Breeder Spotlight—Jayba Cavaliers: A History



Check out our new article—**Breeder Spotlight!**

Jayba, our kennel name, is comprised of the names of our first two Golden Retrievers- Jacob and Sheba. These dogs were our foundation and the start of our kennel in 1972. We showed Golden Retrievers for many years before purchasing our first Cavalier King Charles Spaniel “Dazzle” in 1986. Dazzle, a cute Blenheim female, was purchased for our daughter to show in Junior Showmanship. Because Cavaliers were not a recognized breed at the time, our daughter Michelle showed in the AKC with an ILP number. She also showed in the CKCSC, USA.

We quickly realized that no one could have just one Cavalier and a year later we added “Chester” -Canadian Champion Sylvan Crest Canta Libra at Jayba. Chester was our first foray into showing Cavaliers outside of Juniors. Several other Cavaliers followed who also contributed to our kennel. We showed in Canada, and the CKCSC, USA which at the time, prior to 1996, was the only breed registry for Cavaliers in the United States. Traveling to Cavalier shows at that time was difficult, as our children were young, and showing our

Goldens was still our primary focus.

When Cavaliers were approved in AKC in 1996, I was fortunate to own and finish Ch Jayba’s Crème Brule, “Yummy” and Ch Morningstar Stanley Cup of Jayba. Stanley, a very beautiful, plush dog for his day, was one of the breed’s first AKC Champions. He gradually moved me more into the direction of showing only my Cavaliers. I eventually limited my Golden Retriever involvement over a number of years.

Our attention now strictly focused on the Cavalier, we had some starts and stops down certain breeding paths. We now are fortunate to have our basis for what we are producing. Breeding and showing is always opening and closing doors, growing, learning, fun, heartache, disappointment and hopefully many rewards counted in so many ways. Aside from the love of the dogs, in the sport of showing we have been rewarded with many prestigious wins, of which we are extremely proud. Stanley and Yummy might have been the foundation for our start, but along the way were many other dogs including my first

imported dog Canadian Ch Sukera Toy Boy, whom I brought over from Ireland in the late 80’s. These three dogs gave me some lovely bitches from which to breed.

In 2002, I bred a wonderful dog, who was awarded the 2005 Best Bred by Exhibitor at the Eukanuba Tournament of Champions, Ch Jayba Monte Carlo. At the same time we were afforded the opportunity to purchase Champion Miletree Macnab “Mac” from Miletree Kennel (UK). He is, in the order of the kennel, the middle child, from which I have brought together everything from the past that now proceeds into the future.

“Mac” has given me much, but his most important contribution to date, has been his son our “Teddy” Ch Truluv Kiss ‘N Tell of Jayba. Both “Mac” and “Teddy” received Awards of Merit in the BOB competition at the ACKCSC Nationals for the years 2006, 2007, 2008. Teddy’s son Ch Jayba Don Juan has just had the great honor of, at 17 months of age, going Winners Dog, Best of Winners and Best Bred by Exhibitor at the 2010 ACKCSC National Specialty

The next day, at the Mid Florida Specialty, “DJ” was Winners Dog and Best Of Breed over more than 30 Champions. “DJ’s” mother is our lovely Ch Jordanic Mariella of Jayba . These dogs all have children who continue to reflect well on the quality of their lineage.

We have had some wonderful opportunities to add to our kennel dogs using influential bloodlines represented in the UK. The brother and sister pair we brought over in December of 2008 from England will figure into our breeding program with common ancestors on the bottom side of their pedigree, with what we have here now represented in Macnab. These two dogs themselves are top winning Cavaliers. Multi BISS Ch Cinderlace Bramble of Jayba and his sister Ch Cinderlace Harmony of Jayba. Bramble already proving himself as a stud dog, has several get in the show ring, including our own Jayba Sweet Tea, who was the Reserve Winners Bitch at the 2010 Mid Florida Specialty.

There are many dogs, young and old, that we bred and own, who are currently

showing and doing extremely well. I cannot mention them all, or quite how the younger ones will fit into the big picture. Time will tell.

Through all of this, our human children have grown up! Our son Ben, lives and works in NYC without any pets! Michelle, our daughter, whom most of you know, is our not so “secret weapon”. She has turned into a fantastic handler and is the one who handled “DJ” to his recent wins at the National, and who also finished his mother, “Ella”. Michelle spent years showing as a junior and as a very young girl moved right into the breed ring with the adults without missing a beat.

Michael shows our dogs when he is traveling with the dog food business. It is very convenient to have a spouse who goes to dog shows, is an animal lover and likes the opportunity to take a dog in the ring!

with which I work at this project.

The Jayba Cavaliers of today is the culmination of many years of hard work, and devotion to the breed that I adore—the Cavalier King Charles Spaniel. It has been a long and winding road—one that I have been fortunate to walk with my family and the many friends I have made along the way. I take my responsibility as a steward of the breed very seriously and I hope to have made a positive impact that will have great influence for many years to come.

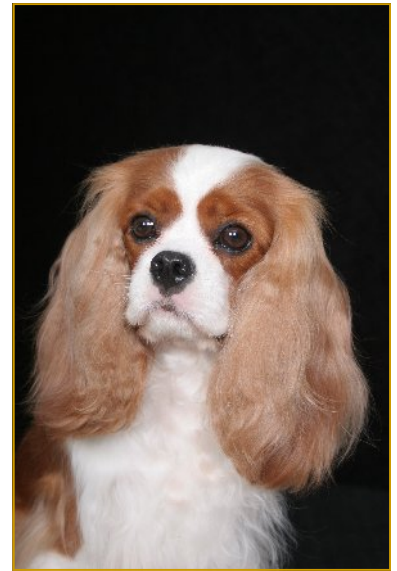
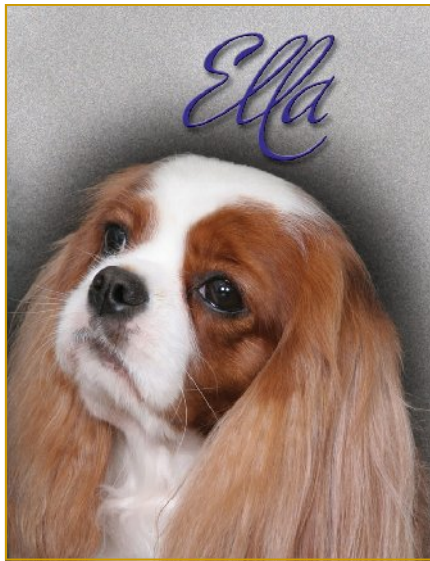

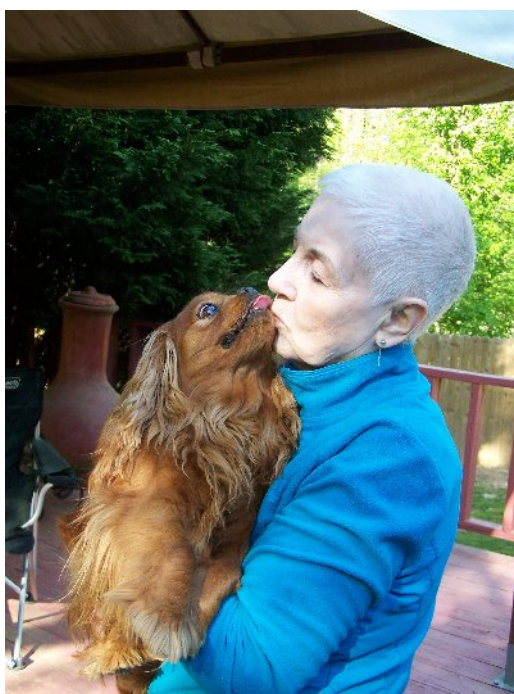

Natural Remedies: Garlic for Dogs



..”For centuries..garlic has been a primary remedy in many cases..”

When it comes to your pet’s health, do you want to follow facts or fears? Unfortunately, garlic has come under attack. This is primarily as a result of garlic’s close cousin onion’s reputation for triggering hemolytic or “Heinz factor” anemia (where circulating red blood cells burst) through its high concentration of thiosulphate. There is no doubt that onion, due to its concentration of thiosulphate, will cause Heinz factor anemia. In addition, as stated by Wendy Wallner, DVM. “Onions are only one of the substances which can cause Heinz body anemia.

Other substances can also cause Heinz body anemia in the dog.” The latter probably accounts for many cases as it is prevalent in creams often recommended for allergy-suffering pets due to its ability to numb the itch. It is absorbed through the skin and builds up in the blood stream. This other substance is likely to have been involved in cases where garlic was suspect.

For centuries, as long as humans have been using herbs, garlic has been a primary remedy in many cases. For as long as people have been using garlic, they have also been feeding it their animal companions. Its properties have proven far reaching, easy on the body and safe to use. In the past fifty years, during the rebirth of holistic medicine in the United States, garlic has been in the forefront. Every text that I have researched on herbal health which mentions pet care has recommended it, especially for its incredible anti-parasitic and anti-septic properties. Garlic is credited to benefit pets with cancer, diabetes, liver, heart and kidney disease, uncontrollable staph infections and a host of other conditions, as well as been a staple in recommended preventative protocols.

It has been widely used by hundreds of thousands of pet owners with no reported negative

side-effects – except its effect on their animal’s breath – until now. This is the point; garlic has suddenly become a “suspect”, not proven the culprit. Do not let mass hysteria determine a holistic care program for your dog. Follow hundreds of years of “proven use” rather than recent “suspicions” in regards to this miracle herb, as garlic is known to be. As with anything, do use garlic in reasonable doses, and do know that you can trust history over hysteria.

As always, consult with your veterinarian before taking any home remedies or supplements or following any treatment suggested by anyone. Only your veterinarian can provide you with advice on what is safe and effective for your pet’s unique needs or diagnose your pet’s particular medical history.

Pet Dental Health

You know from when you were a little child...always brush your teeth after meals or before bedtime...if you don't take care of your teeth you will get cavities, etc.

Well, imagine what state your teeth would be in if you never went to the dentist, never brushed, never flossed?

The same can be said of your cavalier's teeth! You can provide the same basic functions of human teeth care to canine teeth care.

Periodontal disease is the most common disease in dogs and cats. About 85% of dogs and cats have some form of it and are susceptible to the pain, bad breath and tooth loss. Chronic infections could result from poor dental hygiene and spread to the heart, liver, lungs and kidneys where more damage could occur.

There are 4 basic stages to Periodontal disease:

Stage 1—Gingivitis

This can be easily reversed with treatment—marginal inflammation of gums.

Stage 2—Early Periodontitis

This is where the entire gum is inflamed and swollen and an odor is present. Teeth are yellow and brown. Vet and Home treatment can help reverse this

Stage 3—Moderate Periodontitis

Cherry red and bleeding gums. Infection is likely present and bad breath is present. Could be irreversible

Stage 4—Advanced Periodontitis

Chronic bacterial infection destroys gum, tooth and bone. Infection could spread throughout body via bloodstream.

When your cavalier receives their annual checkup, make sure your vet checks the mouth, throat, teeth and gums. Report to them if you think your dog has odor or bad breath.

There is preventative maintenance—brush your cavies teeth regularly, at least once a week with a product specially made for canines. You can find these and tooth brushes at local pet stores and online. Additional maintenance can be to provide an additive to their water, such as *Healthymouth* or a rinse such as *C.E.T.*

Can't get your pooch to open his mouth for the brush—try it every day and reward him for good behavior so they relate it to a treat! Additionally, *C.E.T* make a "rawhide" chew treated with chlorhexidine which helps prevent plaque build up.

If your pet does require a cleaning by a vet and must undergo anesthesia, make sure that a blood test is performed prior to surgery to ensure that he can withstand the anesthesia, especially if your cavie has a heart murmur or known heart disease.



When Skye was recently ill, I must have had over 100 posts asking about him continuously for 3 days.

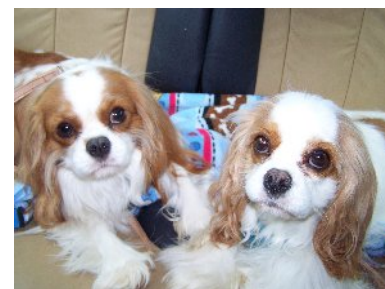
